# Baby cam keeps watch

IT'S the world's smallest in-car video camera, and it's set to have a big impact on insurance claims.

The Exeros Cube 7100 is the size of a matchbox, and can be mounted near your vehicle's rear view mirror. It captures footage at 30 frames per second – half that of a regular entry-level Sony Handycam video camera, for example, but clear enough to establish who was at fault in the event of an accident.

You don't just get the video as proof, though; the Cube also logs data about your driving, such as

your speed at the time of the prang and the G-forces involved. It's all stored on a 2GB microSD memory card included in the package – this gives two hours of recording, although the device can take up to 16GB of storage.

Using the supplied software, you can then upload the footage to your computer and display all the data on Google Maps.

The mounting bracket has a 360-degree rotation function, so you can focus on the road or the driver. The Cube can be attached to the dashboard or windscreen, using super-sticky 3M tape, and

as it's so small, it won't be obvious to thieves – meaning you can leave it in the car.

There's a light-reacting sensor to adapt to changing weather conditions, and the wide-angle lens claims to cover 120 degrees of vision.

The Cube will continuously record for up to two hours, before automatically starting again if required. Users can even set it up to start capturing footage if it senses a shock while your model is parked – ideal for recording a hit and run. For £75 extra, Exeros will hard-wire the unit in your car.

## Wireless wonder pressure washer

CLEAN up with your own power and water supply! The Nomad Cordless pressure washer doesn't need to be plugged in to get your car gleaming.

Unlike the Mobi tested in Issue 1,066, the Nomad has an on-board battery – so you won't get tangled up in the cable running to the 12V socket. The 14-litre water tank is detachable – you simply take it out, fill it up and slot it back in place.

The maker claims it takes only an hour to charge – good for 26 minutes' use and four tanks of water. It has a six-metre hose that sprays at a pressure of 98psi, and is available in green or orange.

## Porsche is in your pocket!

IS Porsche about to take a bite out of the Apple iPhone? The supercar maker has launched its P9522 mobile, complete with a stylish matt black anodised aluminium case and a 2.8-inch mineral glass touchscreen.

And it has an extra trick up its sleeve: a biometric fingerprint sensor. This means your personal data is kept secure, as the phone only unlocks to recognised prints.

Thanks to the thin LED screen, battery life is 300 hours on standby, with 240 hours of talk time. It's light, too, tipping the scales at 139g, and is less cumbersome than the P9521 flip phone it replaces.
